Revitalizing the SR 57/60 Confluence



CA-39 residents know the slowdowns and dangers caused by traffic where State Routes 57 and 60 merge together in Diamond Bar close to the borders of Los Angeles, Orange and San Bernardino Counties. The quality of the roadway has gotten so poor that it is rated the third-worst congested freeway segment in California and the sixth-worst in the entire U.S.

I joined City of Diamond Bar Mayor Nancy Lyons, Mayor Pro Tem Ruth Low, Councilmember Steve Tye, Councilmember Andrew Chou, City of Industry Mayor Cory Moss and Mayor Pro Tem Cathy Marcucci for an update on the project and to speak about the vital importance of revitalizing the freeway to improve safety and the movement of goods and services across our region, state and country.

Soaring to New Heights with Unical Aviation
