I am requesting funding for the Fire Station 66 Facility Modernization Project in Fiscal Year 2027. The entity to receive funding for this project is the Chino Valley Independent Fire District, located at 14011 City Center Drive, Chino Hills, CA 91709.

The funding would be used to modernize Fire Station 66 and renovate key interior infrastructure, including the kitchen, bathrooms, and window systems, to address aging building components that have exceeded their service life. These improvements will enhance firefighter safety and facility functionality while ensuring the station remains a reliable public safety resource. This project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because it will preserve an essential public safety facility while ensuring that emergency responders have safe, functional infrastructure to carry out emergency response activities and protect residents, businesses, and critical infrastructure throughout the 40th Congressional District.

The project has a federal nexus because the funding provided is for purposes authorized under 42 U.S.C. §5305(a)(2) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, which authorizes federal assistance for the acquisition, construction, reconstruction, or installation of public facilities and improvements.
